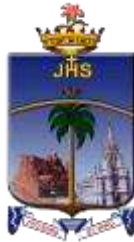

இந்திய அரசியலமைப்பு விதிகளின்படி கல்வி பெறுவது குழந்தைகளின் அடிப்படை உரிமை என்பதால், 14 வயதிற்குட்பட்ட குழந்தைகளை ஒருபோதும் எந்தவிதப் பணிகளிலும் ஈடுபடுத்தமாட்டேன் எனவும், அவர்கள் பள்ளிக்குச் செல்வதை ஊக்குவிப்பேன் எனவும், குழந்தைத் தொழிலாளர் முறையினை முற்றிலுமாக அகற்றிட சமுதாயத்தில் விழிப்புணர்வு ஏற்படுத்துவேன் என்றும், தமிழகத்தைக் குழந்தைத் தொழிலாளர்ற்ற மாநிலமாக மாற்றுவதற்கு என்னால் இயன்றவரை பாடுபடுவேன் எனவும் உளமார உறுதிகூறுகிறேன்.

(On Communal Harmony Day - 20th August)

(On National Integration Day - 19th November)

நாட்டின் சுதந்திரம், ஒருமைப்பாடு ஆகியவற்றைக் காக்கவும், வலுப்படுத்தவும், என்னை அர்ப்பணித்துச் செயல்படுவேன் என்று மனமார உறுதிகூறுகிறேன். மேலும், நான் ஒருபோதும் வன்முறையில் ஈடுபடமாட்டேன் என்றும், மதம், மொழி, வட்டாரம் மற்றும் அரசியல் அல்லது பொருளாதார பேதங்களுக்கு அமைதியான முறையிலும் அரசியல் சட்டத்திற்குட்பட்டும் தீர்வுகாணத் தொடர்ந்து பாடுபடுவேன் என்றும் உறுதி கூறுகிறேன்.

Essence of Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1997

- i) Ragging means:
 - a) Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution;
 - b) Teasing, abusing of, playing practical jokes or causing hurt to such students;
 - c) Asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly do.
- ii) Ragging in colleges is a cognizable offence (i.e., **A Police Officer can arrest without warrant**).
- iii) **Ragging within or without any educational institution is totally prohibited.**
- iv) **Whoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to Rs. 10,000.**
- v) **Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall also be dismissed and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution.**
- vi) Whenever any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution or to any other person responsible for the management, such person shall enquire into the same immediately, and if found true shall suspend the student, who has committed the offence, from the educational institution.
- vii) If the head of the educational institution or the person responsible for management of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action when a complaint of ragging is made to have abetted such person shall be deemed to the offence of ragging and shall be punished as provided for in Section 4 of TNPR Act, 1997.

THE COLLEGE COAT OF ARMS

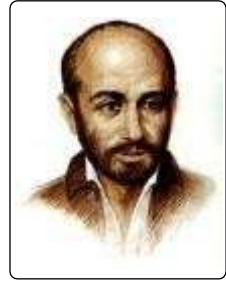


(உண்மைக்கும் நன்மைக்கும்)

The College blazon is not the heirloom of an ancient and noble family handed down with pride of name and glorious memories of the past. It is only a distinctive badge expressing its aim and ideal. It bears azure, with the Trichinopoly Rock and the College Church for distinctive features. The conspicuous Palm tree in the middle is the emblem of the East. It bears in fess a bow and above it, is the monogram of the Society of Jesus. Its crest is a Royal Crown and a Lily issuant, both in honour of the College Patron, St Joseph, the Crown to signify that he was of David's royal blood and the Lily to signify his spotless purity. Thus, the whole in ordinary language would read: The college of St Joseph is conducted by the Fathers of the Society of Jesus, at Trichinopoly in the East. The motto "***Pro Bono et Vero***" (**for the Good and the True**) indicates the ideal which the teachers and the taught should ever keep in their minds as the goal of their efforts in the field of education namely moral and intellectual formation (*From the College Centenary Memorial Volume - 1945*).

ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA THE FOUNDER OF SOCIETY OF JESUS

St. Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus was born in 1491, as the last child of a large Basque family of Spain. The name of Loyola came from the ancestral castle that was the family heritage of St. Ignatius. According to the traditions of his family, Ignatius was trained to arms and to the etiquette of court life. He was badly wounded in a battle with France. As he lay convalescing at Loyola, he read the Gospel Narratives and the lives of saints and was inspired to follow



Christ by giving up all worldly ambition and trappings of power and embracing a life of poverty, sacrifice and service after the example of these saintly mentors.

He began his new life at the age of 31. He spent a year of severe penance and intense prayer in a solitary cave on the banks of the river Cardoner near the town Manresa. He recorded his experiences in the book of the *Spiritual Exercises*, which became the soul and centre, the rule and character of every Jesuit, who came after. Reflecting on the crisis in the Church of his time, he felt that the need of the hour was for the learned and holy priests, free of greed and ambition and ready to serve the poor and to give witness to the love of Christ for men.

To achieve this objective, he set himself in earnest to study from grammar school to college and university in the various Spanish centres of learning, and finally took his Master's Degree from the Sorbonne University, Paris. At the same time, he won over a group of brilliant and like-minded university men one of whom was St Francis Xavier (the patron saint of India), moulded them by the *Spiritual Exercises* and welded them into a religious fraternity which became the *Society of Jesus*. The followers of St. Ignatius popularly came to be known in the course of time as Jesuits.

THE JESUITS

The Society of Jesus is a world-wide organisation of religious men, numbering about 15,500 spread over the world, of whom over 3,000 are working in the provinces of India. In Tamil Nadu alone there are about 500 Jesuits working in schools and colleges, youth services, publication, refugee and migrant services and social work centres, in parishes and mission out-reach programmes, and in almost every form of service and ministry of the Church.

The Jesuit Vision of Higher Education

It is world-affirming. It assists in the total formation of each individual within the human community. It includes a religious dimension that permeates the entire education. It is an apostolic instrument that promotes dialogue between faith and culture.

It pursues excellence in its work of formation and witnesses to that excellence. It insists on individual care and concern for each person. It emphasizes activity on the part of the student and encourages life-long openness to growth. It is value-oriented. It encourages realistic knowledge, love and acceptance of self and provides a realistic knowledge of the world in which we live. It is a preparation for active life commitment. It serves the faith that does justice, seeks to form *men and women for others* and manifests a particular concern for the poor.

It provides adequate personal care and concern for others. It celebrates faith in personal and community prayer, worship and service. It stresses lay-Jesuit collaboration and relies on a spirit of community among administrators, teachers, parents, alumni and benefactors in an atmosphere that promotes community.

It adapts means and methods in order to achieve its aims most effectively with a common vision and a common goal. It assists in providing the professional training and on-going formation that is needed especially for administrators and teachers.

It is an apostolic instrument in the service of the Church as it serves human society. It prepares students for active participation at the Church and the local community, for the liberation and service of others, taking Jesus as a model.

In the context of existing inequalities, injustices and dehumanizing poverty in contemporary society, the Jesuits are committed to challenge and change these oppressive structures through this college, towards the integral liberation of man in collaboration with Christians of different denominations, people of other religions and secular movements working with a similar vision.

Unfortunately, there are lots of people in the educational institutions who suffer from *the Cain Complex* and repeatedly ask the question: *Am I my brother's keeper?* The scholarly privileged class has repeated this question for centuries. These students and teachers have been trained to think only about themselves and their own future. What

is needed is that the college imparts such an education as to give witness to social justice. In short, education must be value-based and value oriented.

Educational enterprise should have faith and justice dimension to bring about the social change. It means that the educated and the educators should be committed to faith and justice.

The Jesuit educational institutions shape students into agents of social change preparing them for concerted social action and thus paving the way to mass movements which will bring about the desired liberation. They will in their admission policies actualize *the preferential option for the poor* by giving a privileged place to the weak who are poor economically and academically and form them as men for others stamped with the Ignatian hallmark of excellence and re-orienting itself in order to respond to the crying needs of today's society. They will also promote research in those branches of arts, sciences and relevant pedagogy which would help build a just social order.

The Jesuits are aware of the great structural constraints they work under and so they have real apprehensions as to how effective their educational institutions could be in bringing about the desired social change through social action. Yet, responding to the greater call to be pioneers and prophets, they engage themselves in this momentous task of liberation with a readiness to pay the price the kingdom demands.

St. JOSEPH'S COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS)

St. Joseph's College is an Autonomous College (Autonomy granted in 1978) affiliated to the Bharathidasan University. It was established in 1844 at Nagapattinam and was shifted to Trichy in 1883 by the Fathers of Society of Jesus (The Jesuits). It was affiliated to the then Madras University in 1866. The college celebrated its centenary in 1944, sesquicentenary in 1995 and acquired the Five Star status, awarded by NAAC in 2000. It was recognised by UGC as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2004, reaccredited by NAAC with A⁺ Grade in 2006, accredited again by NAAC at A Grade in 2012. The college was accredited with A⁺⁺ grade by NAAC in 2019, becoming the first Autonomous Arts and Science College in the nation to attain this much coveted status. St. Joseph's College has secured 25th Rank in NIRF 2023, all India Ranking under College Category.

The College is owned by the Society of St Joseph's, a body registered under Societies Regulation Act (1860), having its office in Tiruchirappalli. St. Joseph's College is meant primarily for the Catholic Minority community of the Town and the State. The institution does admit other students, irrespective of their caste and creed; their religious feelings and freedom of conscience are respected. The college imparts sound formation (religious, academic, social and physical) to the young, based on Christian principles. Every Catholic student therefore attends Religion and every non-Catholic student attends Ethics classes, in which man's fundamental duties to God, to his motherland, to self and to his fellowmen are explained. He/She also takes part in the outreach programmes organised by the college. This Jesuit college trains young men and women of quality to be leaders in all walks of life so that they may serve the people of the nation in truth, justice and love.

Accordingly, this college strives to be an agent of social change, instilling an awareness of the great need in India for social justice based on the dignity of the human person. Thus, it strives to make its own contribution towards transformation of the present social condition, so that justice, equality and the moral values enshrined in the Constitution of India may prevail in the daily life of every citizen of India.

TOWARDS COMMUNION WITH MOTHER EARTH IN HUMAN SOLIDARITY

Excerpts from the statement of the Jesuit Madurai Province Assembly held at St. Joseph's College, Tiruchirappalli on 27-28, December 2009.

We stand at a critical moment of Earth's history and we perceive more clearly than ever before that Mother Earth is groaning under the impact of environmental degradation. We also note with grave concern that Mother India is being subjected to the onslaught of communalism.

The cry from the wounded Mother Earth caused by the unprecedented environmental destruction through depletion of natural resources, desertification, global warming, pollution and widespread displacement of people caused by ill-conceived developmental initiatives is echoed across the universe (GC35 D3/33). In fact, the very survival of the earth community is being endangered. This calls for urgent intervention with effective advocacy to restore the environment as the sacramental site of salvation. In today's global context of growing fundamentalist ideologies based on religion, the secular and pluralistic image of our own country is being tarnished with ever increasing violence. We need to counter this. We should not be mute and passive spectators to the violation of human rights in our country but act as a protest force raising our voices unitedly against such inhuman acts. **In this context, we pledge to promote the culture of dialogue and reconciliation across various sections of our country appreciating pluralism. We hope thus to build up a harmonious and equitable society which upholds the inalienable human rights and dignity of all.**

We acknowledge humbly that our response so far to the ecological disaster and the onslaught of fundamentalism has been minimal and uncoordinated. We are grateful to all people who, with their enduring search for human dignity, permit us to accompany them in this historical striving for eco- restoration and human solidarity.

“God freely created us so that we might know, love, and serve him in this life and be happy with him forever. God's purpose in creating us is to draw forth from us a response of love and service here on earth, so that we may attain our goal of everlasting happiness with him in heaven.

All the things in this world are gifts of God, created for us, to be the means by which we can come to know him better, love Him more dearly, and serve Him more faithfully.

As a result, we ought to appreciate and use these gifts of God insofar as they help us toward our goal of loving service and union with God. But insofar as any created things hinder our progress toward our goal, we ought to let them go.”

SCHOOLS OF EXCELLENCE

- e) thrust in internship and/or project as a lead towards research, and
- f) model curriculum encompassing an multi-discipline approach to cater to the needs of the recruiting industry.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Attendance:

Attendance is obligatory in the College. Students are expected to attend classes everyday without fail. However, if there are some important and genuine reasons such as family functions, ill-health, *etc.*, students can avail leave after obtaining permission from the Vice-Principal (Academic) in the prescribed form available in the College Office.

1. Daily attendance of students is marked in e-register by the individual teachers for every hour and the same is uploaded on the college website. Students are expected to check their attendance entry regularly. In case of any discrepancy, they should get it corrected by contacting the teacher concerned and the Vice-Principal (Academic) within two days. No request for correction will be entertained after two days.
2. Percentage of attendance is computed course-wise. Students are expected to acquire minimum 85% attendance in all the courses offered in a semester. The maximum percentage of absent among all the courses will be considered to condone the lack of attendance.
3. For reasons of illness beyond two days, the leave application along with a medical certificate should be submitted by the parents/local guardian/to hostel director on or before the 5th day of illness. A fitness certificate from the Doctor who treated the student should be submitted to Fr. Vice-Principal (Administration) on the day of rejoining the college. The submission of medical certificate does not entitle a student to earn attendance for the days of his/her absence. The Principal may condone lack of attendance upto 10% on medical grounds. Continued absence without leave (more than 10 days) will render a student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls.
4. Students involved in Co-curricular and Extra-curricular activities and on-other duty (OD) leave and hence missing the regular classes should contact the respective authorities (HoDs, Physical Director, NCC Officer, Coordinating Professor of Cultural Activities, *etc.*), who will recommend the case to Fr. Vice-Principal (Administration) for attendance within four working days.

5. **A maximum of only 15 days per semester is permitted for students on other duty attendance.** However, specific cases which are likely to exceed this limit will be referred to Fr. Principal well in advance for such special permission. On the completion of such activity, they should submit the attendance certificate/evidence.
6. Eighty Five percent attendance in every course is a pre-requisite for:
 - (a) permission to write semester examinations, and
 - (b) award of scholarships of any kind. No exemption will be granted.

Disciplinary Rules

The following acts are strictly forbidden in the College. Students engaged in the following acts will be dismissed / suspended from the college:

1. Ragging of any kind and any magnitude inside or outside the campus.
2. Use of Mobile phones and other electronic gadgets inside class or corridors or in Exam Halls and in working hours. Confiscated mobiles will not be returned on any reason.
3. Any kind of wild, noisy and disturbing behavior during class hours or celebrations in the campus.
4. Smoking, possession or use of drugs, alcohol or peddling drugs in the campus or anywhere else.
5. Taking tuition from the teachers of our College without written permission from the Principal.
6. Any kind of misconduct/misbehavior inside/outside the campus (in public places, buses, trains, *etc.*) or detection of foot-board travel, blocking the traffic, unruly behavior in buses/trains or any kind of annoyance to the public will also result in the immediate withdrawal/permanent cancellation of all student travel concessions and the scholarships, *etc.*,
7. Malpractices such as cheating, bribing, gambling, copying in tests and exams, giving false declarations, spreading rumours/ writing/ printing/ disturbing/ displaying unauthorized notices of any kind, *etc.* in the campus or anywhere else.
8. Inviting/ meeting strange or unauthorized persons inside the campus without written permission from the Principal.
9. Causing damage to college/public property.
10. Violating rules of the college during Student Council Elections.

Library Rules

1. Absolute silence must be maintained in and around the library. Loud consultation, animated conversation, *etc.* are strictly prohibited.
2. The library will remain open between 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on all working days. On Saturdays the library will be kept open from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Lunch break is between 12:30 p.m. and 1:30 p.m.
3. The library is fully computerized. Searching, issuing and returning of books are done through computers.
4. The students are advised to keep their bar-coded identity card (ID) safely and not to lend their ID to any other student. While entering the library, students should show their ID for borrowing books.
5. Students are permitted to take books from the stack and return the same between 10:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Book-Bank books will be used to the needy and poor students on request. After borrowing books, the students are advised to check the condition of the book before leaving the counter.

Vehicle Parking

Students who come to college by a two wheeler or four wheeler must contact Vice-Principal (Infrastructure) for registration and other details. Vehicles must be parked only in the parking lot.

Dress Code

Students are expected to be in simple and formal dress and properly groomed in the college premises.

Girls : Girls must wear either saree with sleeved blouse / churidar / salwar kameez (**Leggings and Jean Pants not permitted**) with sleeved long *kurta* with *duppatta*.

Boys: Boys must wear full formal pants with formal shirt. T-shirt is not allowed.

Wi-Fi Facility

Students have access to free Wi-Fi in the college premises. They are expected to make use of the facility responsibly.

To Parents

Parents and guardians are requested to cooperate with the college authorities in the formation of good character, in maintaining regularity in attendance and progress in studies of their children/wards. Attendance of students is available on the college website www.sjctni.edu and in SJC Parent App.

Parents/guardians are advised to check in person with HoDs/Vice- Principal regarding the attendance of their children/wards. The results of even and odd semesters are published in the months of May and December respectively. All the parents/guardians have to come with their wards for the Parent-Teacher Meeting schedule by the college.

A student once enrolled for a programme is expected to complete the same. He/she may not withdraw from the institution without informing the Principal in writing. Otherwise, he/she will be liable to pay fees for the entire period of the programme and his/her name removed from the roll.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The college has opted for *Choice Based Credit System* for the students admitted in UG and PG Programmes from 2001. It is applicable to all the Programmes under the Aided and Self- Financing Sections. The students of diploma courses do not come under this scheme.

The objectives of the credit system are:

- To provide mobility and flexibility for the students within and outside the department;
- To provide broad-based education;
- To enable students to learn at their own pace;
- To provide students scope to acquire extra credits;
- To impart to students more job-oriented skills; and
- To make any course multidisciplinary in approach.

From 2021-22 onwards, the college promotes the extended version of CBCS under Outcome Based Education (OBE) model as expected by the UGC called LOCF.

- ❖ A student is expected to attempt all the three CIA components, Library referencing and appear for Mid and End Semester tests to acquire minimum CIA in a course. The following are the distribution of the CIA marks.

- ❖ The various assignment Components (suggestive) could be Quiz (written / objective), Snap Test, *Viva-Voce*, Seminar, Listening Comprehension, Reading Comprehension, Problem Solving, Map Reading, Group Discussion, Panel Discussion, Field Visit, Paragraph / Essay Writing, Open Book Test, Library Record, Writing Composition, Case Study, Online Test, *etc.*
- ❖ As a special consideration, students who publish papers in refereed journals would be exempted from one of the assignment Components in one of the courses at PG level.
- ❖ One of the assignment components for UG & PG will be of 15 marks which is compulsorily objective Multiple Choices Question (MCQ) type. This component must be conducted by the department / faculty concerned in **online mode**.
- ❖ Student who absents himself/herself from a component or Mid semester test for valid reasons will be given another opportunity, provided he/she produces relevant documents as soon as he/she returns to the college within a week.
- ❖ The required pro-forma for rewriting the Mid semester test or assignment component is available in the website. Fr. Principal has to give permission using his discretion based on the recommendation of the course teacher and HoD concerned.
- ❖ Students are eligible to write Semester Exams only after they score 40 marks in a course for UG and 50 marks in a course for PG Programmes. **There is no CIA Improvement.** Those who fail to acquire the minimum CIA are entitled to appear for CIA Arrears.
- ❖ **CIA Arrears** (if any, during the study years) will have the same components as that of the Regular CIA. The Library referencing Marks are to be carried forward to

the CIA Arrears from their Regular study. Time interval to clear CIA Arrears will be a period of TWO years with a maximum of FOUR attempts with the same syllabus.

- ❖ **CIA Arrears** (after the student leaves the college): The student will have to follow the question paper pattern suggested by the O/o CoE.
- ❖ Community Service (SHEPHERD - an outreach programme) is a unique and compulsory course for all UG & PG students. SHEPHERD in Part-V, Foundation Courses and Bridge Course in English in Part-IV are also important courses of the UG degree programme. If a student fails to fulfill the requirement of all the courses, he/she will not be receiving the degree certificate.

Malpractices

- ❖ In case of malpractice in the **Mid/End Semester tests**, the CIA for that particular course will be scrapped and students will not be permitted to appear for the semester examinations for that course alone; but he/she will be permitted to do so in the consecutive semester as an arrear course after gaining the required CIA marks.
- ❖ In case of malpractice in the **Semester Examinations**, all the courses in that semester remain cancelled except for the courses such as Practical, Project, Internship. However, his/her CIA marks will be considered. He/she will not be permitted to appear for two semesters (including the current). He/she could appear only after two semesters. However, he/she is permitted to appear for arrear examinations.
- ❖ In case of malpractice in the **Arrear Examinations**, all the arrear courses will remain cancelled. He/she is permitted to appear after two semesters (including the current). His/her CIA marks will be considered.
- ❖ In case of malpractice in Lab Courses either in Semester Examinations or in Arrear Examinations conducted earlier to or later to theory examination, the student will be debarred from writing exams or gets a remark absent. The student can attempt after two semesters (including the current).

Time Ceiling for Completion of Degree

The Academic Council permits UG students to complete their programme within five years (3+2) and PG students within four years (2+2) as per UGC guidelines. Thus **time span = N+2 years for completion of programme, where N = minimum duration of the programme**. If there is any change in the course due to change of syllabus, the equivalent course identified by the respective HoDs and Dean of that school will be the new course for CIA and Semester Examination. Previous CIA marks will not be considered for acquiring the degree.
