The value added course “Diet Therapy” is continued. Finally, the content of the syllabus was approved by the members of the board. The meeting came to the end by 1:45PM.


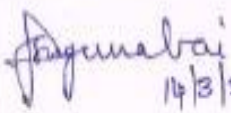
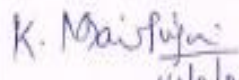

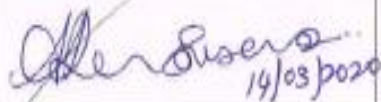

The Board of Studies meeting for M. Sc and M. Phil syllabus revision was held on 14/03/20 at 11.45 am in the Department of Biotechnology, St. Joseph's College, Trichy - 2. The chairman welcomed the board members. The University nominee, Dr. M. Manickavasagam, (Associate Professor, Department of Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering, Bharathidasan University, Trichy); Mr. J. Dinesh Raja (Assistant Professor, Department of Biotechnology, Bishop Heber (Autonomous), Trichy); Mr. P. Anand (Process Lead, Omega Health Care Management, Tiruchirappalli) was absent; Mrs. A. Asha Monica (Alumnus & Ph. D scholar, Dept. of Botany, St. Joseph's College, Trichy - 2) and the faculty members of the Biotechnology Department attended the meeting.

The M. Sc syllabus was placed before the board. The board members went through it and discussed elaborately.

Dr. M. Manickavasagam (University Representative) has suggested

- (1) The segregation of topics in Recombinant DNA Technology paper (Viral vectors for Plants and animals respectively).
- (2) Removal of Bacterial gene expression & merging of transformation of bacteria by Calcium chloride with Blue-white screening methods in Laboratory Course II paper
- (3) Removal of Animal cell culture vaccines in Unit 5 of Microbial Biotechnology paper and
- (4) Inclusion of Molecular Assisted Selection and Breeding in Unit 3 of Plant and Animal Biotechnology paper.

Mr. J. Dinesh Raja (Subject Expert) has insisted:

- (1) The removal of "Growth factors – erb, sis. Transcription factors – Fos, JUN, AP1, V-erbA in Unit IV of Cell signalling paper.
- (2) Inclusion of "Regression analysis" in Unit IV of Bioinstrumentation & Research Methodology paper.
- (3) Inclusion of "Synthetic seeds preparation" experiment in the Laboratory Course V.
- (4) Removal of Embryo/Endosperm culture experiment in the Laboratory Course V.
- (5) Inclusion of Food processing industries in Unit IV of Food Biotechnology paper.

Ms. A. Asha Monica (Alumni) has suggested:

- (1) The inclusion of "SPSS" in the Laboratory Course III.
- (2) Removal of "animal vectors" in the Unit IV of Plant and Animal Biotechnology paper.

The Faculties of Biotechnology has insisted

- (1) Removal of "surface reactors" in Unit II of Microbial Biotechnology paper.
- (2) Inclusion of "sequence algorithms" in Unit IV of Bioinformatics.
- (3) Change of IDC (WS) course title "Medical Biotechnology" to "Medical Biotechnology and Cancer Biology" in Semester III.
- (4) Shuffling of Unit III contents (Food spoilage) to Unit II in Food Biotechnology paper.
- (5) Expansion of SPC as "Standard plate count" in Laboratory course IV.

There is no change in the M. Phil syllabus contents. The syllabus is unanimously accepted by the stakeholders.

The Stake holders insisted to follow the previous marks pattern (Practical and Viva voce examinations) for PG degree and suggested no changes in the evaluation pattern.

The Previous Value added course will be continued for the next Academic year 2020-2021.

The M. Sc syllabus is modified as per the discussions made, circulated among the board members and approved.

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES IN ENGLISH HELD ON 14.03.2020

The meeting commenced with a short silent prayer. The minutes of the Pre-Board of Studies were read out by HoD, and passed in the meeting.

HoD invited the industrial expert Ms. Mariselle Gemez, Dinkys Global Enterprises, Melapudur, Tiruchirappalli, to introduce the syllabus for the new paper, IELTS, which would be included as an Add on Course. Speaking of the importance and the advantages of the new Course, Ms. Mariselle said that it would be a thirty-hour Course, which would consist of five units, each with six-hour duration. It will encompass grammar, vocabulary, and development of LSRW skills.

HoD asked Ms. Mariselle Gomez to suggest the ways for implementing the Course at St. Joseph's College. She said that initially 'to train the trainer' programme could be adopted. That is, the Professors of the Department would, first, be trained, by the experts. After being trained, they would teach the students. She added that the students, in order to take up this Course, will have to undergo a 'diagnostic test,' and the fees would be around Rs. 5000 per student to pursue this Course. Furthermore, the exam fees for a student would be Rs. 13,000. HoD asked whether the Course has to be offered to all the Departments. Dr. Xavier Pradheep Singh stated that since majority of the students do not go to foreign countries for higher education, the number of students getting enrolled for this paper would be very less, and therefore, the Course could be thrown open to the whole College. He added that the thirty-hour duration is too less for the Course. Ms. Mariselle spelt out that the paper was meant for those students who would have basic language skills.

Dr. Cheryl Davis suggested that instead of IELTS, 'Spoken English' could be offered to students. Rev. Fr. Rufus felt that IELTS could be offered, and thus, opportunities could be created for the students to study it, and we could look for the response of the students.







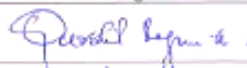

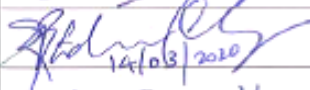
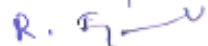








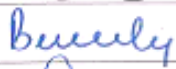

Dr. K.T. Tamilmani, Dean, Academic Affairs & Associate Professor, Department of English, Nehru Memorial College, Puthanampatti, recommended the idea of offering IELTS Course to students. Hinting at the importance given by MHRD to online Courses and NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning), Dr. Tamilmani held that the students could do about 20% of the Core papers through NPTEL.

Dr. Xavier Pradheep Singh proposed the idea of signing an MoU with the external agency and the experts from the concerned Agency could come and teach our students. He believed that since our Professors teach General English, the students may not like them once again to come and teach them.

The suggestions given by the outgoing UG and PG students were read out by HoD. The UG students put forward a suggestion of conducting workshop on Journalism, Content-Writing, and Creative Writing. They also insisted on inclusion of extra courses on language skills. The PG students suggested that 'Contemporary Literature' and 'Modern Theories' could be added as separate papers in the syllabus, and new techniques in Research Methodology and Teaching could be a part of the syllabus. They were very appreciative of our syllabus, which, according to them, is very useful for preparing for SET/NET and other competitive examinations.

The Board of Studies meeting for the Department of Business Administration was held on **14.03.2020**. The meeting commenced with a formal prayer followed by welcoming and introduction of the external and internal members by Dr.B.Augustine Arockiaraj, Head of the Department. An industrial expert **Mr.N.Kanagasabapathy**, President TIDITSSIA, academic expert **Dr.S.MohammedMohideen**, Assistant Professor, Jamal Mohammed College and our alumnus **Mr.Yugeshwar Ravichandran**, Assistant Manager, Sales, Bajaj Finance Ltd., were the external panel members for the meeting. The discussion mainly focused on the minor modifications /changes in existing UG syllabus, changes in the Books for study/reference, changes in evaluation of UG Practical and Viva-voce examination, and preparation of external evaluation list and to propose Value Added Courses for the academic year 2020-2021.

The following minor modifications /changes in existing UG syllabus have been done:

A new unit on “GST” was introduced in the Subject “Accounting Package for Managers” instead of VAT.

GST practical sessions have been introduced in the existing course on “Financial Advanced Accounting Packages”.

The concepts of Game Theory are included in the existing course “Operations Research for Managers”.

The concepts of Job costing and Batch costing have been included in the existing course “Cost Accounting” instead of Reconciliation of Financial and Cost Statement.

Minor spelling mistakes in the existing syllabus have been identified and rectified.

Changes in Books for Study/References:

Minor changes, in the form of altering the Books Revised and Latest Editions, Additions and Deletions in Text Books and Reference Books were made.

Changes in evaluation of UG: Practical and Viva-voce Examinations:

There are no changes in the existing practical evaluations and viva-voce examinations.

Proposed Value Added Courses for the academic year 2020-2021:

The existing value added courses were altered as “Business Analytics for Industries” in the odd semester and “NGO Management” in the even semester.

Preparing External Examiners List for Theory Papers:

The External Examiners List for Theory Papers was prepared and submitted to the Controller of Examination.

The Head explained that the curriculum is strengthened with the help of ACCA and ISDC support and also stated that nine courses are incorporated in alignment with ACCA syllabus. He also stated that the primary focus of this course is to provide strong knowledge base in Accounting, Analytics and Taxation. Having observed the course pattern the university nominee appreciated the course structure. The Alumni representative suggested that more thrust could be given for seminars that may enable the student to strengthen their communicative skills. The head replied that the duration of classes are stretched with 6 hours from 9.30 AM to 3.30 PM and the 6th hour is meant for skill training. The floor approved the course pattern and the first year syllabus.

With regard to the Value added courses, the Head stated that the Department is offering a paper titled Accounting Software for Business Decisions which requires approval and the members appreciated the initiatives and approved the same. The Head also stated that an MoU is signed with Tally academy for offering Tally course that will provide certificate from Tally Academy and the name of such student's name will be added in the placement panel. The course will be offered to all the students of the college and to the students from other colleges. However, the decision is yet to be arrived at to make it compulsory to the commerce students.

Another value added course on Mass Media and Business Development with similar methodology was presented by the Director of Alaigal Media, A communication Institute by Salesian Fathers. He was invited as a special invitee to present the same. The members suggested that the unitization must be in alignment with the UGC directive with 5 units and it was approved by the floor.

Relating to change in the valuation pattern, the Head presented that the Internal question pattern is revisited and a new pattern is evolved by the members as follows,

Section A (MCQs)	9 * 1 = 09 marks
Section B (internal choice)	3 * 5 = 15 marks
Section C	3 * 12 = 36 marks
Total	60 Marks

The board approved the proposal and to incorporate the same from the ensuing end semester test onwards.

There was no further points for discussion, the Head thanked all the members and invited all for the working lunch arranged in the college canteen.

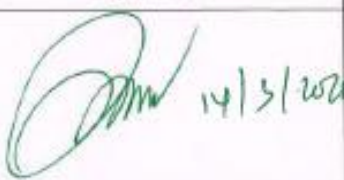
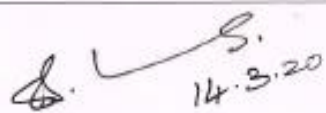
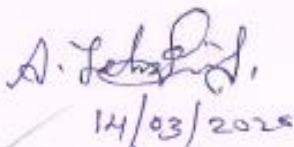
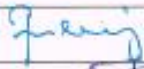
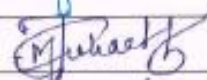
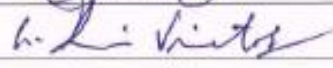
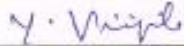

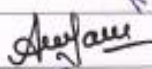
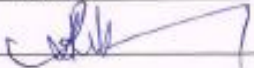
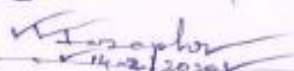
By the by, the board had a detailed discussion on the evaluation process related to viva voce examinations, finally they opted to move with the practice that is preventing now.

UG

I SEMESTER

Basic Electronics

Prof. V. Anuradha enquired about the credits regarding the UG syllabus. Rev. Fr. J. John Wilson presented the I UG syllabus. He said that there are no changes in this paper and the book for reference is also very easy to learn for beginners. Dr. I. Johnson explained to the externals that during the MOCK visit for NAAC the team has given good remarks about the syllabus. Experts asked about the results of the paper from first semester and faculty members said it was good and then the paper has been passed.

II SEMESTER

Electric Circuit Analysis

Dr. I. Johnson insisted to update the book for reference with recent version for all papers for both UG and PG. Prof. V. Anuradha enquired about the marks allotted for problems in semester question paper and she requested to include more problems since it is a problem oriented paper and the board noted the suggestions and then the paper has been passed.

Electronics practical I

Regarding the practical experiments Dr. Anbarasu asked whether the students have done all in photo devices experiment. We replied to him that students have done all in this experiment. DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF STUDIES IN PHYSICS HELD ON 14.03.2020

The Board of Studies of Physics was started with a prayer at 11.45 AM on 14-03-2020 in the Smart Classroom. The Subject Expert, Dr. G. Muralidharan, Professor of Physics, Gandhigram Rural Institute, Gandhigram, Alumni Miss. R. Divina, Research Scholar, Gandhigram Rural Institute, and the Student representative Mr. S. JoswinJoshwa (18 PPH 113) and all the Faculty members of the Department were present, except the University representative Dr. S. Rajasekar from Bharathidasan University, Industrial Expert, Mr. M. Jesuraj, Chief Executive, Hi-Tech Electronics, Trichy, Dr. I. Johnson, Dr. A. Leo Rajesh (CL) and Dr. M. Antony Arockiaraj (ML).

The Chairman of the Board welcomed the External members and the faculty members of both Shift – I & Shift – II.

Dr. P. Rajendran read out the minutes of the previous Board of studies held on 27th March 2019 and the same was passed.

The chairman briefed about agenda of the Board of Studies.

Post Graduate Programme

The PG course pattern and syllabus were presented at the board. The course pattern was passed. In the syllabus of various courses, three clarifications were raised and the same were discussed.

1. Physics for competitive examinations (course code: 18PPH1301, IDC)

Dr. S. Dinakaran suggested an addition of reference book by Resnick and Halliday. Subject Expert clarified title and author's name of the book. After a discussion, the book, Fundamentals of Physics, by David Halliday, Jearl Walker, and Robert Resnick included as book for reference and the syllabus passed.

2. Material Science – I (course code: 18PPH3201A, Core Elective)

Dr. A. Leo Rajesh and Dr. M. Dinesh Rajacited that similar topics are found in unit-I of Material Science – I and in unit-IV of Material Science – II and recommend that it is more appropriate to be in Material Science – II.

The boards well taken the comment, following topics were removed from unit-1 of Material Science – I and the syllabus passed.

Topics removed from unit-1 of Material Science – I

‘Development of microstructure in isomorphous alloys – mechanical properties of isomorphous alloys – Binary eutectic systems – Development of microstructure in eutectic alloys.’

3. Quantum Mechanics (course code: 18PPH2105 Core)

Dr. S. Alfred Cecil Raj brought an observation on the topics

- Unit-II: 3D problem of Spherical Square well potential
- Unit-III: Spherical harmonics, Addition of more than 2 Angular Momenta.

As they consume more hours to complete the content, and it demands polynomial solutions to be remembered to solve problems, it is extremely difficult for students. Hence it is requested for deletion.

On discussion, the subject expert suggested that for few courses certain equations and recurrence relations can be provided during the exam, so that the candidate's ability to work with them is tested. However, the suggestion to delete these two topics is accepted. The above two topics were deleted and syllabus passed.

Post Graduate Question Paper Pattern for CIA and Semester:

In present question pattern, 20% of questions as problem solving are recommended. Now it is brought to the board to make it is as compulsory to improve the problem solving skill, which will be helpful for NET/SET examination. After discussion, it was accepted to have 20% of questions as problem solving is compulsory. In the present question pattern Section-C will have only problem solving questions both for CIA and Semester examinations from the academic year 2020-2021 onwards, which contribute to approximately 20% of the whole question paper.

Under Graduate Project Evaluation:

The board recommends the UG Project Evaluation as 75% for report with a passing minimum of 30 marks and the Viva-voce for 25% with a passing minimum of 10 marks. For Viva-voce, the guide is the internal examiner and another one examiner as internally external (a faculty within the department).

Under Graduate Value Added Course:

In the academic year 2019-2020, management has established 15KVA Solar Power System in Physics department with 10KVA on-grid power generation, 3KVA and 2KVA as training module cum power generator. It is suggested to start a value added course on

'Photovoltaic Solar Panel Installation and Maintenance'

from the academic year 2020-2021. It is accepted at the board to start the above course along with the two existing courses.


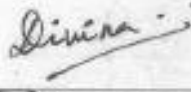
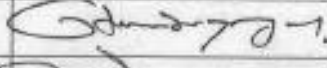
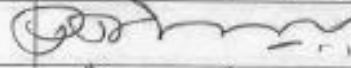

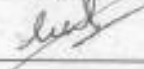
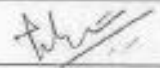
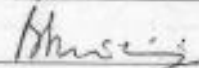

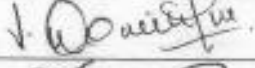

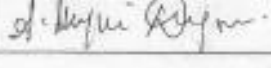

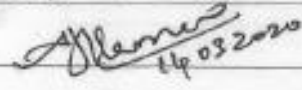
